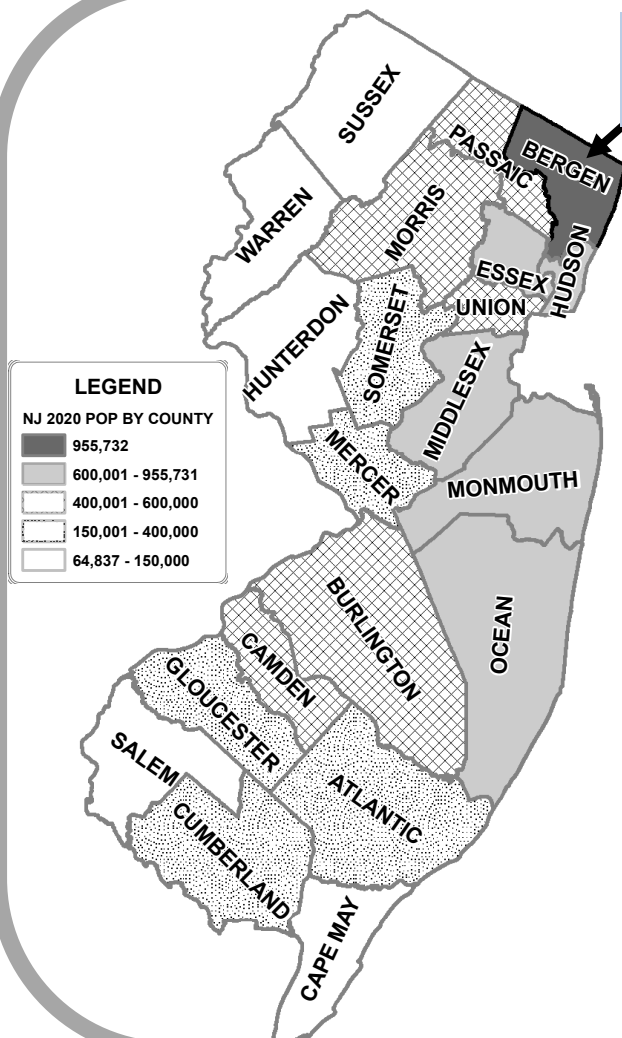

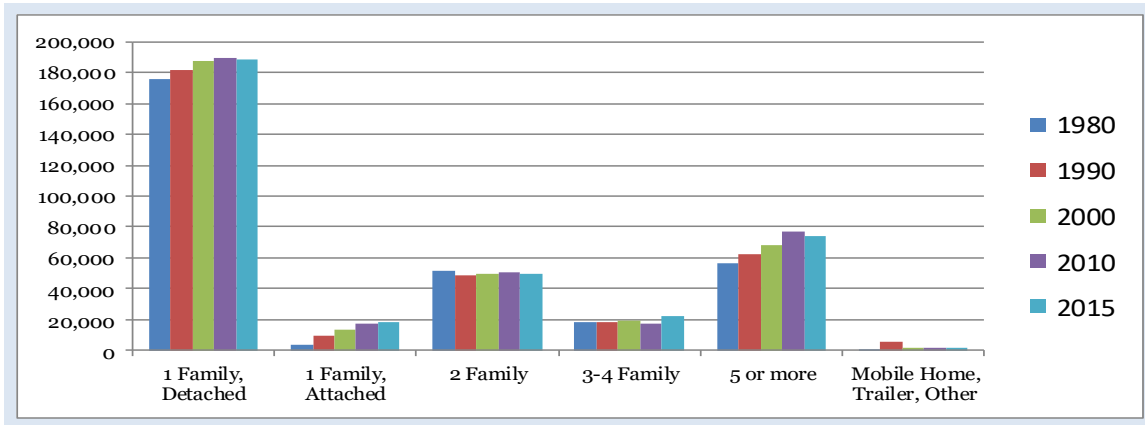

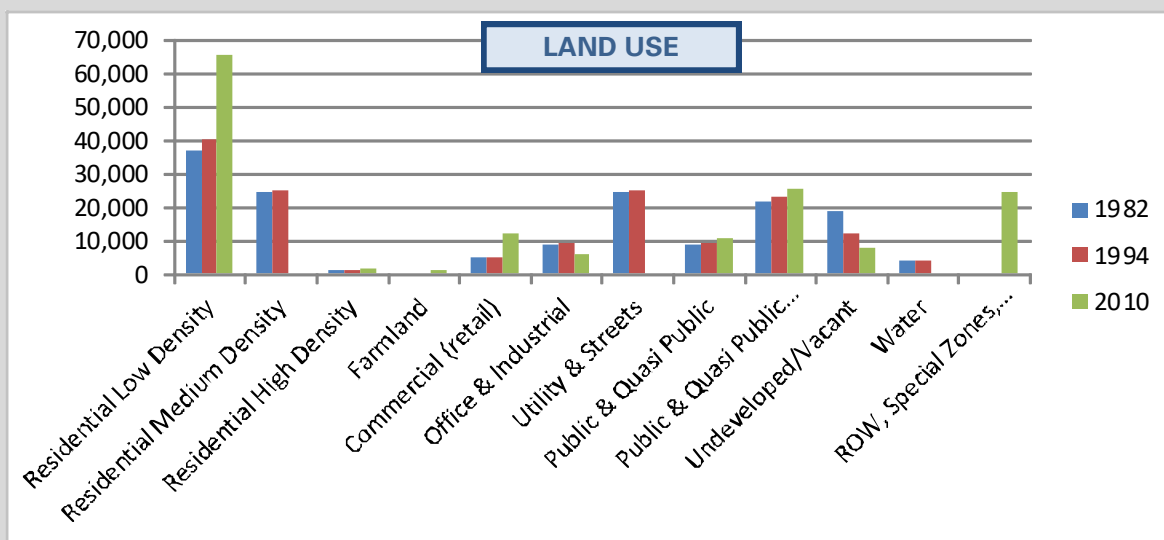

The General Tax Rate is a multiplier for use in determining the amt. of tax levied upon each property. Expressed as \$1 per \$100 of taxable assessed value. This rate is used to compute the tax bill. Ex: General Tax Rate: Assessed Value 150,000 General Tax Rate .03758 = Tax Bill 5,637. The Effective Tax Rate is a statistical study that enables the comparison of one district to another district (based on assumption that all districts are at 100% valuation). This rate is NOT to be used to compute the tax bill.
